STATE BOARD OF CPA EXAMINERS ELECTS 2019-2020 OFFICERS

RALEIGH -- The North Carolina State Board of Certified Public Accountant (CPA) Examiners has elected officers for the 2019-2020 fiscal year that began April 1, 2019.

Arthur M. Winstead, Jr., CPA, of Greensboro, was elected President; Michael S. Massey, CPA, of Morrisville, was elected Vice President; and Gary R. Massey, CPA, of Raleigh, was elected Secretary-Treasurer.

Art Winstead, a North Carolina CPA since 1980, was appointed to the Board in 2017. He previously served on the Board 2003-2009. He is a general services partner in the Greensboro office of DMJ & Co., PLLC, and is the firm-wide Accounting, Auditing, and Quality Control Partner.

Appointed to the Board in 2018, Michael Massey has held a North Carolina CPA license since 2009. He is Vice President of Product and Wealth Management at Georgia's Own Credit Union.

Licensed as a North Carolina CPA in 1980, Gary Massey was appointed to the Board in 2018. He is Director (Triangle) at CliftonLarsonAllen, LLP, and is Senior Advisor, Healthcare Policy and Finance with Cansler Collaborative Resources, Inc.

About the Board

Established by Chapter 93 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the State Board of CPA Examiners is an occupational licensing board that grants certificates of qualification as CPAs to those individuals who meet the statutory requirements. The Board also adopts and enforces the rules of professional ethics and conduct to be observed by CPAs in North Carolina. An independent State agency, the Board is composed of seven members appointed by the Governor. Five members must be holders of valid and unrevoked NC CPA certificates as issued by the Board in accordance with the NC General Statutes. The remaining two members, who are not CPAs, represent the interests of the public-at-large. North Carolina. As of April 3, 2019, North Carolina has 21,899 CPAs with active licenses.
